Caregivers of Veterans with Dementia


Educational Sessions offered by Hospice of the Valley

Hospice of the Valley, an internationally recognized leader in innovative dementia care, is offering no-cost educational sessions to help caregivers of military veterans with dementia. Sessions can last from 1–3 hours with longer sessions addressing more concrete details, including more time for questions and discussion. The presentations will be given by members of the Dementia team—comprised of a physician, nurse practitioners, social workers and educators. The program and individual team members have received honors and awards for their work from organizations including the *International Journal of Palliative Nursing*, the Visiting Nurse Association of America and the Arizona Alzheimer's Consortium.

Caregivers who attend the session will:

- Learn how changes in the brain due to dementia impact thinking, functioning and behaviors.
- Discuss how to customize approaches to prevent or minimize common challenging behaviors in the person with dementia.
- Identify key considerations for future healthcare decisions and planning.

Alzheimer's disease and related dementias are the epidemic of our time. More than five million Americans have Alzheimer's disease, now the third-leading cause of death. Dementia is emerging as an important healthcare issue for veterans and their families as our veteran population ages. Recent studies suggest that people who suffer Post Traumatic Stress, highly prevalent among veterans of combat, are twice as likely to develop dementia.



As the disease progresses, the person with dementia becomes increasingly dependent upon others to be kept safe and have their daily needs met. Families typically assume a demanding and complex role as dementia caregivers with little to no training and support. Over time, many dementia caregivers suffer from significantly higher levels of stress,

fatigue and chronic illnesses. Providing caregivers with education helps maintain their health, as well as improving patients' well-being, studies show.

The educational sessions are funded in part by the Arizona Department of Veterans Services available through the Arizona Veterans' Donations Fund.


